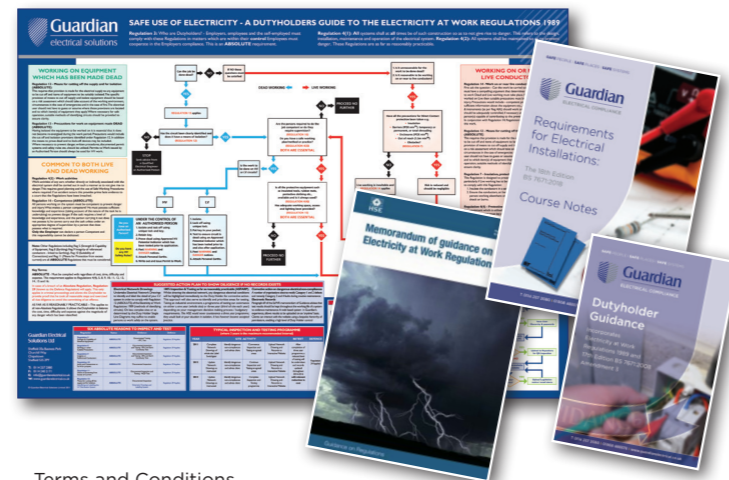

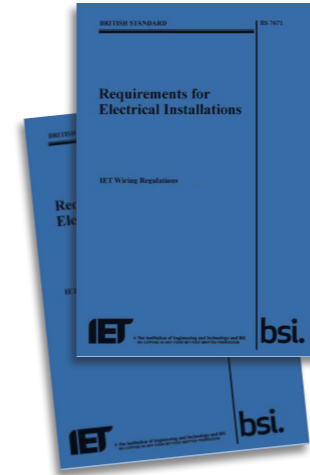

NEW IET Wiring Regulations 18th Edition - Overview of the changes



An update of the changes to BS7671:2018 IET Wiring Regulations and how they may affect you as a Dutyholder. Summary of the changes linked to Inspection and Testing.

Corporate Manslaughter Act 2007 - Can I be implicated?

This offence is concerned with corporate liability and does not apply to directors or other individuals who have a senior role in the company or organisation.

However, existing health and safety offences and gross negligence manslaughter will continue to apply to individuals.

Recent tragedies have focused the minds of Health & Safety Professionals, and this section of the seminar is intended to clarify their position with respect to accountability.

Arc Flash Hazard - A real and present danger

Electrical arcing (sometimes called a 'flashover' or 'arc flash'), perhaps as a result of a short circuit caused by unsafe working practices, can generate intense heat leading to deep-seated and slow-healing burns, even if it persists for a short time.

This presentation will describe the arcing phenomenon, how to perform a risk assessment and how to implement appropriate risk control measures in order to manage the arc flash hazard as follows:

- Correct selection of use and equipment
- Actions for Managers and Supervisors
- Accessing Safe Working Practices

- Typical Permit to Work
